	vulnerable the victim is and what resources are required to trace the offender via social
	networking sites that often operate abroad and to different legislation. In certain cases it
	may be difficult to take action if the offender isn't in the UK. They will work with the
	victim to bring about the most suitable and proportionate conclusion, this will include
	alternative options that include the officer in the case using their discretion and working
	with the offender to record an apology to the victim.
