

#### How to help your child read this book

Your child has been taught to 'blend' sounds (that he or she has previously learnt) to read words.

Ask your child to read the word on the right hand page. (Do not read the word to your child first.) Ask your child to say the sounds and work out the word. If he or she hesitates, ask him or her to say the sounds more quickly and have another go. (If your child has difficulty, please let the teacher know.) Then ask your child to turn the page to check if he or she was right – using the picture to check. Note that where two letters are underlined, the letters make one sound. Repeat with the other words in the book.

Don't make your child struggle too much and praise them when they succeed.


