
Day 1 Lesson 1: Maths

Units of measure.

Today, you are going to be measuring different objects around your house using different units of measure.

A unit of measure that you could use is your hands or feet. However, when you are measuring make sure you are accurate.

In 'object' you can either draw or write the object that you are measuring.

Then you are going to 'estimate'. Remember this is a sensible guess.

In the 'measurement' section you are going to write the length that you measured.
